Do NOT operate Easy Dunker during a storm	
Do Not allow anyone to hit target with hands	
When being dunked, the <u>dunkee must keep hands on knees and sit forward</u> on the seat	
Never stand on seat	
Never use hard balls	
The dunkee must move toward the front of the tank when coming up out of the water to avoid hitting their head on the se	at
The dunkee should use the handles to assist in climbing out of the tank and for getting back up onto the seat after being dunked. However, the <u>dunkee must not hold onto the handles while being dunked</u>	
Before (and each time) the dunkee climbs on to the seat, they must first Make sure the seat is securely locked in place and the safety latch is engaged	<u>that</u>
To keep from slipping, the dunkee must always wear rubber sole shoes	
Anyone with medical conditions which may place limitations on their physical exertion (such as, but not limited to: heart condition, pregnancy, back injury, etc.) should stay off the dunk tank	
Keep all non-swimmer, anyone less than 5' tall or over 250 pounds off the tank	
Only one person at a time should be allowed on the seat or in the tank	
Keep water level filled to at least 8" from the top of the tank	
Keep Dunker away from electricity	
Never place the dunk tank on a platform or stage (NOTE: when fill, the dunk tank weighs over 45,000 pounds)	
Cordon off a "danger zone" in front of, to the sides of and behind the tank. Keep people out of the zone to avoid getting his an errant or deflected throw. Children should NEVER be allowed inside the "danger zone"	it by
Easy Dunker MUST always have an adult operator on duty when in use When tank is going to be unattended, always drain water. NEVER LEAVE A DUNK TANK FILLED WITH WATER UNATTENDED	ı
